Dear Friends,

As I reflect on the infancy narratives of Jesus Christ in the New Testament, several themes are apparent to me: fear of the unknown, miracles and hope. Christ's birth, while at first causing apprehension for Joseph and the Virgin Mary, was a miracle that brought hope to all humanity for salvation.

I see some of the same themes in the work of our Franciscan Sisters of Allegany. As a newcomer to the St. Elizabeth Mission Society, I have been reading the history of our Sisters. Did you know that the Franciscan Sisters of Allegany were the FIRST American Congregation to establish a mission abroad? In 1879, the Sisters accepted a group of Scottish Franciscan tertiaries who were ministering in Jamaica into the Congregation, and they sent several Alleganies to join them in Kingston. The Sisters ventured into Brazil, South America in 1946 and then began serving in Bolivia in 1965.

Please remember the following persons and intentions in the Mass at the Motherhouse Chapel on Christmas and in all the Masses to be celebrated during the Christmas Season.


