St. Anthony of Padua-June 13, 2013

My Dear Friends,

June 13th, the Feast of St. Anthony of Padua is a very special day for all Franciscans but more so for all of you who have a very personal relationship with him. He is known throughout the world for his miraculous powers given to him by God for the spread of the gospel. You may know him as the Wonder Worker-Finder of Lost Articles, Healer, Missionary and Lover of the Poor. You may also have your own special devotion unique to the love you feel for the Beloved Saint.



Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195. He joined the Canons Regular of St. Augustine, but shortly after ordination, transferred to the Friars Minor. Devoting himself to spreading the faith, he converted heretics in Africa, France and Italy. He was the first member of the Order to teach theology to the friars. His sermons are notable for their

learning and gentleness. He died at Padua in 1231 and was canonized less than a year later. In 1946 he was named the Doctor of the Church. (Franciscan Morning and Evening Praise)

Both Anthony (1195-1231) and Francis (1181-1226) were contemporaries for six years 1220-1226. Their personal contacts, as far as we know, were minimal. There is testimony of a contact between the two by way of an affectionate note, full of veneration and esteem, that Francis sent to Anthony,

"his Bishop," between the end of 1223 and the beginning of 1224 in Bologna. With this, Francis authorized Anthony to teach theology to the monks, but asking him to ensure that this did not interfere with prayer. (www.saintanthonyofpadua.net/portale/santantonio/spirito/francescano/fra1.asp)
