could see it in action when I visited. Many of them feel called to live and work among the very poorest of the poor. Sr. Maria José (front) has been active in various ministries, but she is happiest when she is helping those who are poor.

This important work needs to continue this year! Every month, the Mission Society provides \$4,400 to support ministries in Brazil, Jamaica and Bolivia. This funding provides much needed food and medicine to many families; diapers and health care for young mothers; school supplies, uniforms, tuition and lunch programs for students; job skills training; and religious education. Additionally, four of our Sisters will be starting a mission in Mozambique, Africa, and the Mission Society will be awarding \$60,000 in grants this summer.

I am asking for your help. It is only through your generosity that our Franciscan Sisters of Allegany and their partners in ministry are able to offer their loving ministries. Sr. Aparecida Maria Guimarães, who ministers in Ceres in the state of Goiás in Brazil, says it well:

"We thank the Mission Society for its generosity and kindness by sending this monthly budget that provides considerable help for the underprivileged people in the communities where we work. It is a way for the Congregation to extend a living example of solidarity among the poor, contributing to the improvement of the quality of life of the people benefitted by the program. Thank you very much."
